Bright, dark pink-red. Aromas of crushed red berries, licorice and violet, complicated by a whiff of tobacco and loam. Intense red fruit and woodsy underbrush flavors are lifted and extended on the long, tactile finish by harmonious acidity. This young, lively *rosato* displays good balance and a nicely ripe, round mouthfeel that is very typical of Cerasuolo d'Abruzzo. I think Barone Cornacchia makes highly traditional, lovely Abruzzo wines; it's an estate that deserves to be better known.

Bright red; the rather deep color is typical of Salento's *rosato* which are much darker in their pink color than are Chiarettos or Provence Rosès, for example. Delicate spice nuances complicate the apple and red cherry aromas. Then rich and fresh, with strong notes of quinine complementing the crisp orchard fruit flavors. Finishes round and full, with insidious sweetness and lovely sugar-acid balance, not to mention a slight tannic bite. A lovely if atypical Negroamaro *rosato*. The wine's name is a reference to the twelve hours of skin contact.

Bright pink. Deep aromas and flavors of pomegranate, winter melon and white flowers. Finishes suave and thick, with lively acidity extending the precise, sneakily concentrated flavors on the long, bright back end. The above average concentration and lovely mouthcoating texture distinguish this outstanding *rosato* from many of its peers in 2016. At 90% Syrah and 10% Sangiovese, its blend distinguishes it too, as Syrah is not the most commonly used variety to make *rosatos* in Italy, though some very good ones do exist.
